Archival Research (8-12)

This program introduces students to the museum's Archives Research Room. The class will learn about Elmer Oswald's experience as a pilot during WWII through the letters he sent home. They will have the opportunity to work with original documents and discuss ways of learning from primary evidence.

BC content, competency and skill goals with grade levels

- Students will understand the difference between primary and secondary evidence
- Students will think critically about the reliability and credibility of a source based on its bias, purpose and proximity to events
- Canada's role in World War II
 - The impact of the global conflict on our local community
 - discriminatory policies and injustices in Canada and the world, including internments
 - World War II internments (e.g., Japanese, Italian, German)
