Japanese Internment Program (6 - 12)

Students explore the experiences of Japanese-Canadians interned during WWII through the firsthand account of one local family. The class will have the opportunity to take a tour of the *Soyokaze*, the cod fishing boat owned by Shigekazu Matsunaga. It was the only fish boat to be successfully reclaimed after being confiscated during the war.
