Other Times Other Ways (K - 2)

This program will introduce children to the Kwakwaka'wakw, Coast Salish and Nuuchahnulth peoples of northern Vancouver Island. The focus will be on their families, homes, food, transportation and potlatch traditions.

The activity will allow students a chance to handle a number of tools and artifacts such as button blankets and robes.
