Where are the Children? Healing the Legacy of Residential Schools (5 – 12)

This engaging program begins with a film in which adults who attended residential schools describe their experiences there. Students will participate in a short simulated lesson and, depending upon availability, hear the account of a guest speaker about their personal experiences of residential school and its effect on their life.

This program can be quite emotional for some students.
