Protocols to protect against COVID-19

To ensure the safety of our visitors and staff, our protocols throughout the Museum and Archives have changed in accordance with the B.C. Public Health Authority. Following are details specific to your visit to the Archives:

- If you are sick, anyone in your household is sick, or you have been advised to self-isolate, please cancel your appointment and we will re-schedule.
- We anticipate that during your visit it will be difficult to maintain adequate social distancing, therefore you are required to wear a mask during your time in the Archives Research Centre.
- When entering the Archives Research Centre, you are required to sanitize your hands.
- Gloves will be available if you feel you would like to wear them. You may also be asked to wear gloves depending on the type of material you are viewing.
- Archives visits are restricted to one researcher at a time. That limit can be amended to two researchers at a time, but only if they reside in the same house.
- Prior to your arrival, all touchpoints, including tables and chairs, will be sanitized.
- The Archives will no longer be providing pencils. You are asked to bring your own. We do not use pens in the Archives Research Centre.
- Due to scent sensitivities, we ask that you do not wear any scented products.
