

## Grease Trails and Otter Tales (4–12)

The Pacific fur trade developed quite differently in coastal British Columbia than it had in the rest of Canada. Our program examines this unique history of competition and partnerships, as well as the short and long-term impacts of the fur trade on Northern Vancouver Island.

### BC Curriculum Connections

- Discriminatory policies and injustices in Canada

- Discriminatory policies and injustices in Canada

- Impact of historical exchanges of ideas, practices, and materials among local B.C. First Peoples and with non-indigenous peoples
- Contemporary challenges facing B.C. First Peoples, including legacies of colonialism
