



Heritage Interpreter Summer Positions at the Museum!

Returning students who have completed at least one year of university are invited to apply for a position as a Heritage Interpreter at the Museum at Campbell River, situated on central Vancouver Island in British Columbia.

Heritage Interpreters at the Museum are responsible for the delivery of a wide variety of engaging and interactive interpretive programs which can include: leading summer day camps, guided walks and tours, demonstrations of heritage crafts and activities, history-based puppet plays and theatrical vignettes. Depending upon current Covid-19 public health regulations or orders, the interpretive programs may have to be adapted and delivered in a virtual format rather than in person.

Students in Anthropology, Communications, Education, History, and Museum Studies will find relevant application of their academic training in this position. Students should be proficient with the Microsoft Office suite of software, and previous knowledge of, and comfort with, Canva, Zoom, and I-Movie would be an asset but is not required. Students should have a valid driver's license. A criminal record check will be required. Excellent communication skills, familiarity with, or an interest in, regional and local history, an outgoing personality and an ability to work well with people of all ages, especially children, is required. The ability to speak a second language, French or one of the 5 local First Nations languages would be an asset.
