

Grease Trails and Otter Tales (Grades 4-8)

The Pacific fur trade developed quite differently in coastal British Columbia than it had in the rest of Canada. Our program examines this unique history of competition and partnerships, as well as the short and long-term impacts of the fur trade on Northern Vancouver Island. In our First Nations and Transitions Galleries, we will delve further into the coastal trade networks. Placing themselves in the role of European fur traders, students will use leadlines to chart the ocean floor and avoid nautical disaster.

This 2-hour program includes 30 minutes of outdoor activity.
