In this program, students will be introduced to the life and legacy of Roderick Haig-Brown. As an avid fly-fisher, pioneering conservationist, acclaimed author and magistrate, Roderick left his mark in Campbell River and beyond. His writing has influenced fisheries biologists, ecologists and countless others interested in the evolving relationship between people and nature. The highlight of this program for many students is the exclusive tour inside Haig-Brown's study, in which Roderick wrote many of his 25 books and over 200 articles and speeches.

The majority of this 2-hour program takes place outdoors.
