Unsinkable: The Soyokaze Story (Grades 5-12)

This program explores the experiences of Japanese-Canadians during the Second World War through the firsthand accounts of local families. Students will take an exclusive tour on board the *Soyokaze*, a cod fishing boat owned by Shigekazu Matsunaga. *Soyokaze* was the only confiscated boat to be successfully reclaimed after the war and has been meticulously restored to its original layout. Students will have the opportunity to hone their origami skills and practice using a Japanese phonetic alphabet.

This 2-hour program includes 30 minutes of outdoor activity. As a safety precaution, we are unable to board *Soyokaze* in hazardous weather conditions such as ice and heavy rain.
